Largest public transit project in Québec in the last 50 years

Light rail 100% electric and automated

26 stations, 67 km

In service by late 2021 from Central Station to Rive-Sud station

Rehabilitation of southbound overpass



- Work required to ensure the structure's integrity
 - Corrections to the outer coating
 - Replacement of bridge bearings
 - Cleaning and painting of steel structure

Disruptions and reopenings





De la Commune/Smith sector – Preparatory work

- Site preparation:
 - Removal of some gantries
 - Partial demolition of edges of De la Commune bridge
 - Relocation of public utilities
 - Construction of an access ramp
- Pillar foundations
- In coordination with Canadian National (CN)





Lachine Canal – Construction of elevated structure

- Protection of Smith Square and street furniture
- Construction of temporary jetties and pillars
- Beam and deck installation
- To come in 2019: removal of jetty, finishing of deck and preparatory work for the electrical system and tracks

Anticipated impacts



- Traffic disruptions

- Cyclists: The bicycle link on Wellington Bridge will remain closed until the end of December
- Cars: Short-term disruptions under De la Commune bridge and on Brennan Street
- Pedestrians: No disruptions are scheduled
- Noise, dust and vibration
- Occasional night work
 - Need to prevent disrupting rail traffic during the day
 - Noisy work concentrated during the day where possible

Track modernization – Griffintown

- Replacement of existing tracks
- Removal of infrastructure:
 - Catenaries
 - Tracks and ties
 - Ballast
- Waterproofing of overpass
- Logistics zone on Williams Basin site





Widening of De la Commune bridge

- Creation of a dedicated REM track
- Widening of De la Commune bridae
 - Pillar construction
 - Widening of the deck
- In coordination with
 Canadian National (CN)





Widening of structure to be built

De la Commune/Smith sector

- Connection to the elevated structure
- Creation of berm on which the REM will travel:
 - Construction of drainage system
 - Construction of retaining walls
 - Construction of a pillar

Obstructions and trucking	 Traffic management plan, in collaboration with the City Presence of flaggers and adapted signage
