Linear work — along the REM right-ofway



Necessary when there is insufficient space in the right-of-way to construct a sloping embankment


- In the form of stacked concrete panels
- Wall heights vary between 2 and 6 metres (usually around 5 metres)
 - Approximately 1.5 metres higher than the old railway line







Permanent noise barriers



Installed wherever the modelling identified significant sound impacts along the route







Progress of work – linear



Upcoming work:

- ⇒From February 2022 (progressive work):
 - Construction of retaining walls and sloped embankments
 - Installation of permanent noise barriers
 - Installation of the tracks
 - Installation of anti-intrusion fences

Anti-intrusion fences

- 2.4 metres high

- 2.4 metres between posts





Rivière-des-Prairies-1 railway bridge (RDP1)



Completed:


- Construction of the structure of the new RDP1 railway bridge
 - Two tracks to allow the REM to travel in both directions
- Removal of the jetty (in-water work platform)

Upcoming work:

⇒No work planned until spring 2022



Rivière-des-Prairies-2 railway bridge (RDP2)



In progress:


- Disassembly and rebuilding of the old railway track (track 1)
- Construction of a new track to allow the passage of the REM in both directions (track 2)





Upcoming work:

- Completion of the RDP2 bridge structure (transition slab, etc.)
- Delivery of material via Île Bigras
- ⇒Starting in May 2022





Île-Bigras station




















In progress:

- Excavation
- Concrete structure





As of November 24, 2021:

- Reopening of Chemin du Tour as a one-way street (in front of the park-and-ride lot)
- One-way traffic on the Chemin du Tour loop

Coming in January 2022:

 Alternating traffic on Chemin des Rocailles





Upcoming work:

- External envelope of the station
- Interior fit-out
- Construction of the future road link next to the station
- ⇒Planned work in different phases until 2023–2024



Mitigation measures to promote coexistence

Examples of mitigation measures



Noise

- White noise back-up alarms on all NouvLR equipment (and subcontractor awareness)
- Temporary acoustic barriers

Dust

 Use of a more effective dust suppressant in the right-of-way

Continuous monitoring

Overall schedule of upcoming work in your area

Main work in 2021, in brief



Work phases	Schedule for 2021 and early 2022
RDP1 railway bridge	No work until spring 2022
Along the railway right-of-way: construction of walls and embankments, installation of noise barriers, tracks and fences	Start of work in February 2022 (progressive work along the right-of-way)
Construction of the future permanent road link	2022
Des Sources station construction	Ongoing, until 2023–2024 (in different phases)
RDP2 railway bridge: Completion of work on the bridge structure	As of May 2022

Major milestones



2022: Construction of retaining walls and embankments in the right-of-way

2022: Scheduled opening of new road link next to the station

2022: Construction of the station's exterior envelope

2022–2023: Interior fit-out of the station, installation of rails and electrical systems

2024: Testing of the REM on the tracks and commissioning planned for the fall



Fondations de la station Île-Bigras (automne 2021)

Nature des travaux

Le 31 décembre 2020, le train de banlieue sur la ligne Deux-Montagnes a cessé définitivement. En 2021, d'importants travaux prennent alors leur élan sur les îles Laval:

- La construction de la station Île-Bigras et du futur lien routier permanent
- Le doublement des voies

Mise à jour - Novembre 2021 : changement de circulation aux abord de la future station Île Bigras

Un changement de configuration de la circulation aux abords de la station est à prévoir à partir du 24 novembre à partir de 17h jusqu'à la fin du mois d'avril, si les conditions météorologiques le permettent. Les changements suivants pourraient être reportés à une date ultérieure en cas de pluie et/ou modifiés sans autre préavis :

- Mise en sens unique de la grande boucle du Chemin du Tour avec mise en sens unique en provenance du Chemin du Mistral vers rue du Pont (réduction d'une voie de circulation).
- Mise en sens unique de la portion du Chemin du Mistral à l'est de la future station avec présence de signaleur.
- Chemin des Rocailles, entre Chemin du Bois et Chemin du Tour (à l'ouest de la future station): entrave partielle sur la portion ouest du Chemin des Rocailles avec mise circulation en alternance. Cette entrave temporaire est prévue pour procéder à de la pose de conduites pendant approximativement sept mois.
